MEET THE YOUNG FESTIVAL TRUMPET IN WORSHIP

Installed in September of 2018, the 8' Young Trumpet takes its place in the organ of Naples United Church of Christ as the commanding, most declamatory voice within the three-manual and pedal, forty-four stop/fifty-nine rank pipe organ.

Located just behind the grille of the Pedal/Great exposed windchest (on the right-hand side as one faces the chancel), the hooded resonators project their tone directly into the nave of the church. Utilizing Cavaille-Coll style parallel shallots, this stop is voiced on 12" of wind pressure.

This addition provides solo trumpet stops of contrasting style, allowing the organist to tailor registration for the requirements of liturgy and literature.
