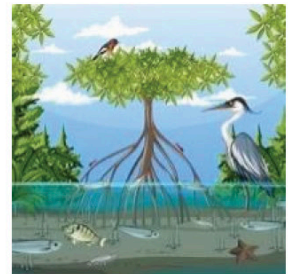

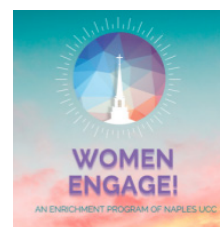

NUCC Justice Committee and Greater Naples Leadership (GNL) are co-presenting a totally nonpartisan, impartial and informative presentation by Sandy Parker on April 8 from 3 to 5 p.m. in Beverly Hall. It will be live-streamed, but not recorded. So save the date! Sandy has been keeping Collier residents informed about What's on the Ballot, for years now. She has presented at the church in the past and is well known as a source of heavily researched, totally nonpartisan information. She has a monthly blog, Sparkers Soapbox, with nearly 3,000 subscribers, which covers news on local government and community actions.

The summer primary is often overlooked by residents, especially those who will go north for the warm months. But it can be a decisive election for many local offices. Florida will hold its 2024 Primary Elections on August 20. Some races will be decided on that date; winners in others will face off in the General Elections in November. In this presentation, we will review the state and local offices and candidates that will be on the ballot for Collier County voters and give you a jump-start for being a more informed voter. This program is open to members of NUCC and GNL.
